OUR FIRST PROJECT: AN INTRAOPERATIVE 3T MRI SCANNER

Philips Ingenia MR-OR solution for intraoperative neurosurgery

Thanks to Children's Champions together we funded a life-saving 3T MRI scanner that makes our neurosurgery department one of the most advanced and patient-focused departments in the country, meaning patients travel from all over for treatment at our special hospital.

ithin the first seven months of its installation, this life-saving scanner was used on 1,324 patients, many of which underwent brain surgery.

This incredible piece of technology is, right now, saving lives at Sheffield Children's Hospital thanks to the generosity of our Children's Champions. The scanner gives neurosurgeons access to clearer images when scanning and operating on children, meaning they can be more precise where millimetres matter. In children, the full resection of a tumour is in effect a cure.

One child who used this machine was scanned during an operation by a surgeon who thought he had removed the entire tumour. The accuracy of the imaging meant a tiny 4mm slither was detected, which would have been missed on a less advanced machine. The surgeon was then able to remove the remaining tumour there and then.

Completely removing tumours
which were previously inoperable
is now a more realistic option."

In September 2015, Ebony Taylor became the first patient to use the 3T MRI scanner.



DID YOU KNOW...


- Referrals to our hospital have risen by more than 34% in the last five years highlighting that our hospital is at the forefront of paediatric care.
- Our emergency department can see up to 200 children per day as well as around 57,000 children each year.
- Our hospital is not just in one place. Our health visitors and school nurses work with the local authority and GPs to ensure that children are kept healthy. Our community paediatricians, nurses and therapists work with families to minimise hospital stays.
- Bone experts from Sheffield Children's Hospital have and will continue to travel to India to give life-improving surgery to children and provide advanced medical training to medical staff.
- 1,324 patients were scanned on the 3T MRI in the first seven months alone. 192 of those scans had brain surgery and any tumours operated on during that time were removed completely.
- 269,000 children come from all over the UK each year for treatment at Sheffield Children's Hospital, that's more than Great Ormond Street.

A LIFE-SAVING FLUOROSCOPY SUITE

n late spring 2017, we took delivery of a Multipurpose Fluoroscopy System that will transform the way patients are scanned and treated by providing real-time, moving X-Rays.

12 year old Ella Sparham was one of the first patients to use the Multipurpose Fluoroscopy Machine which was funded by Children's Champions, alongside funds raised through the Herd of Sheffield and Dan Walker's Golf Day.

Ella's condition means her kidneys don't flush properly, causing frequent infections, pain and discomfort. It also prevents her from enjoying many of the things her friends enjoy, like sleepovers. After being referred to Sheffield Children's Hospital, Ella now has a diagnosis and urology specialists have begun appropriate care.

The Fluoroscopy also heals patients with vascular trauma. It means our radiologists can now treat children both in an emergency situation – such as trauma and life-threatening catastrophic bleeding – as well as in a planned manner for treating conditions such as cancer and disorders of blood vessels

The outstanding technology means a child's system of blood vessels can be scanned in real time, and is benefiting services including gastroenterology, urology, orthopaedics, feeding tube replacement, emergency surgery and respiratory bronchograms.
